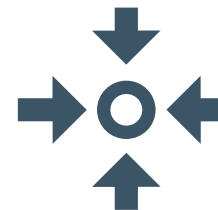


This chart is a helpful way of identifying the partners engaged in your work and their relationship to the result that you are trying to accomplish.

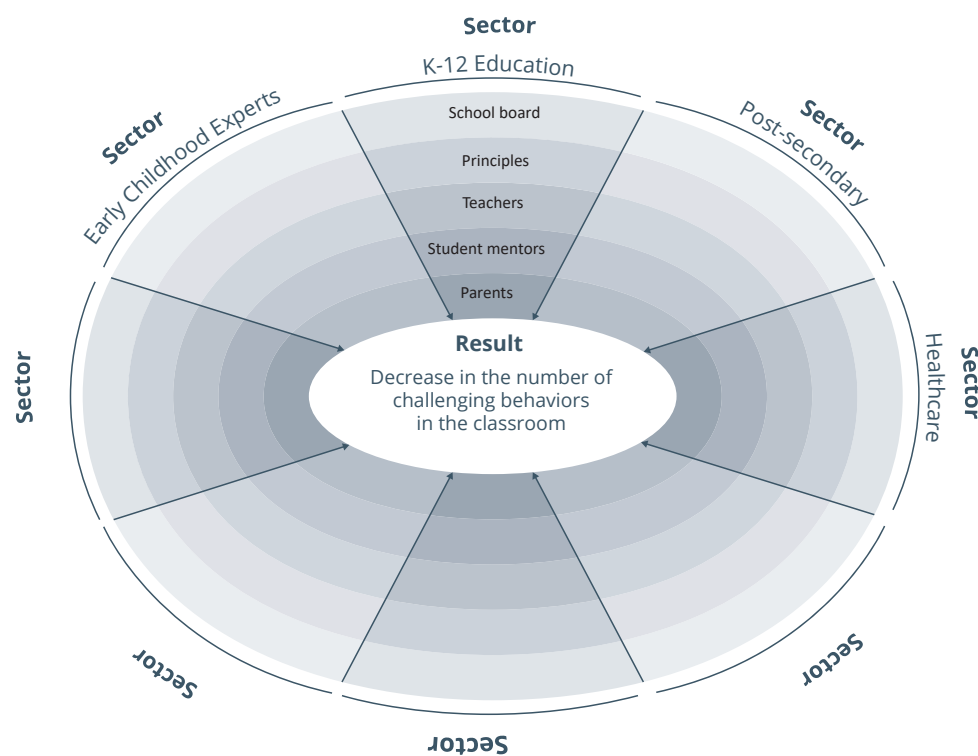
Results at the Center



The Results at the Center Chart helps you visualize how people are related and easily see where gaps are in relation to the distance between access to results and authority.

How to fill out chart:

1. Write the result that your partnership is trying to accomplish.
2. Write the different sectors (or sub-sectors - K-12 Education, Post-Secondary Education, Philanthropy, Government, Non-Profit, etc) that you have engaged in this work.
3. Write the names, titles and/or organizations that are working with you to complete this work. Place each person/organization in the sector that work in according to how closely connected they are to achieving the result. Often times this means that the people who work directly with children/students are closer than people who work on the behalf of students.



Terms and hierarchy

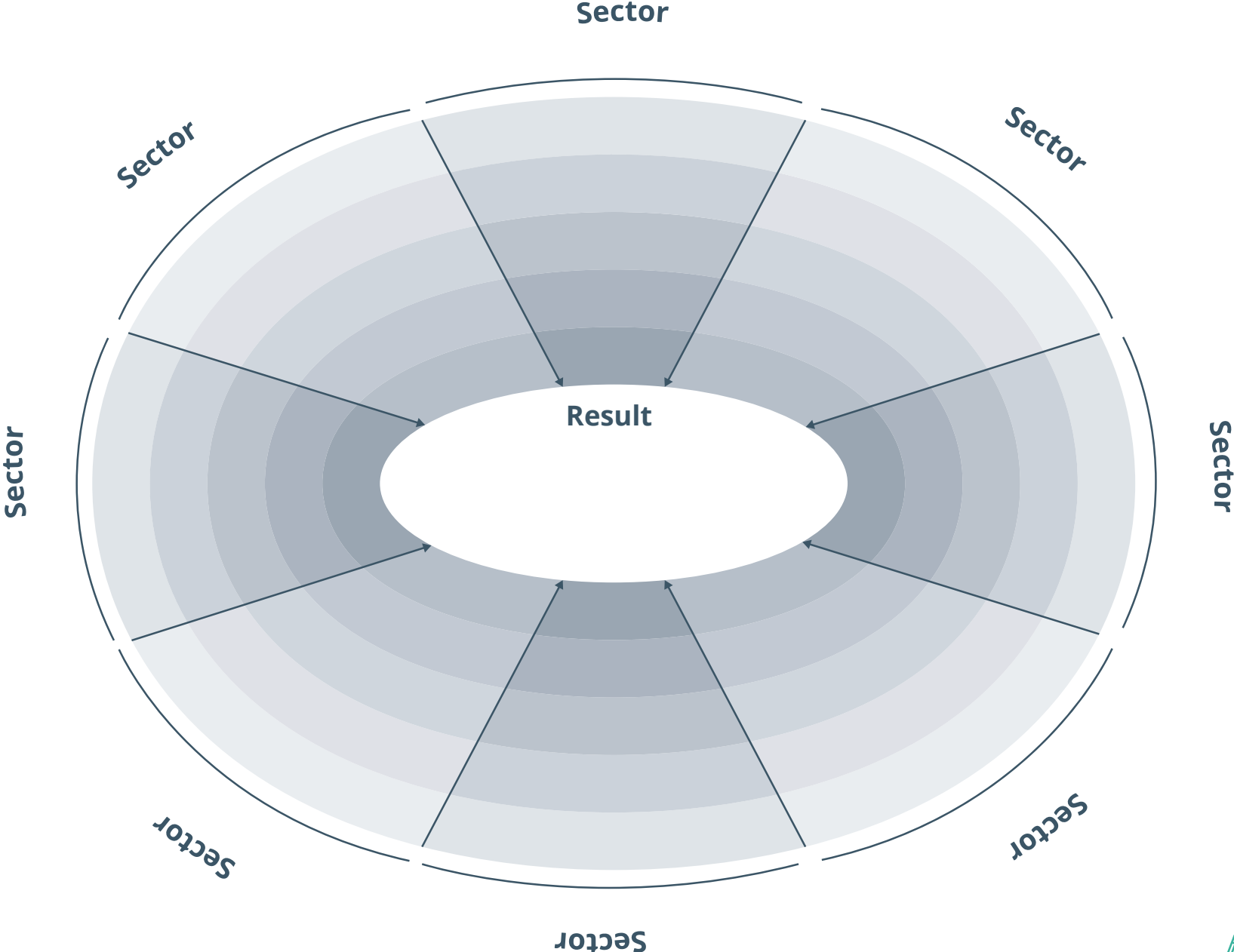
Sectors are the general classification of a group of industries or organizations. ex. "healthcare" or "local public schools".

Stakeholders are those who are currently involved in advancing your result. However, while you go through this process you might notice gaps and think of more people who should be involved. Make note of those!

The Result is the overall outcome your organization hopes to accomplish through engaging diverse stakeholders.
